

The Northwest Indiana Symphony Youth Orchestra offers a select group of young musicians a dynamic and rewarding experience with a strong emphasis on artistic excellence, personal growth and exceptional performances. The Youth Orchestra is comprised of students from Lake, Porter, LaPorte and Jasper counties in Indiana, and Cook County in Illinois.

The Orchestra is under the leadership of Philip Bauman, Orchestra Manager of the Northwest Indiana Symphony and Music



Director of the LaPorte County Symphony for 23 years. The Youth Orchestra presents three major concerts each year, and a side-by-side concert with the Northwest Indiana Symphony Orchestra.

Orchestra members rehearse Sunday afternoons, 2-4:45pm, September through May, at the Center for Visual and Performing Arts in Munster. String players entering 8th grade and wind, brass and percussion players entering 9th grade through the age of 21 are eligible to audition.
